RENO-SPARKS LIVESTOCK EVENTS CENTER - FACT SHEET

LOCATION:

1350 N. Wells Ave. Reno, Nev.
Located just minutes from downtown Reno and within a 10-minute drive from Reno-Tahoe International Airport.

RSLEC GENERAL:

The Reno-Sparks Livestock Events Center (RSLEC) serves as the home base for prestigious western-style events including the National Reined Cow Horse Association Snaffle Bit Futurity, the American Cowboy Team Roping Association National Finals, America West 4D Finals, Region III Arabians and the Reno Rodeo, all held on an annual basis. The multi-purpose facility, which boasts 43 acres of space, two indoor and two outdoor arenas, 660 stalls and a 20,000-square-foot exhibit hall, also welcomes a variety of sporting, consumer and community events throughout the year. Monster truck, motocross, circus, 4H, youth and collegiate sporting competitions are just some of the activities that take place at the RSLEC, in addition to consumer-based shows featuring everything from antiques to trains to auto, RV and boat sales.

Main Arena:

- Climate-controlled
- 6,200 seats
- 150 foot x 300 foot dirt floor arena
- Three show offices

Livestock Pavilion:

- 1,000 seat arena or auction area
- Connected to main arena by tunnel
- 100 foot x 125 foot covered cutting arena
- 90 foot x 200 foot outdoor dirt arena

Rodeo Arena:

- Lighted outdoor rodeo arena
- 9,491 total seats plus viewing suites
- 325 foot x 170 foot dirt floor arena

Exhibit Hall:

- 20,000 square feet
- Climate-controlled
- 100 foot x 200 foot cement floor

- American West 4-D Barrel Racing Finals, held annually in October
- Nevada State Fair, held annually in August
- NHRCA Snaffle Bit Futurity, held annually in September
- UNR Ski Swap, held annually in November

The Reno-Sparks Convention and Visitors Authority (RSCVA) owns and operates a number of meeting and convention facilities. The more than 500,000-square-foot Reno-Sparks Convention Center is one of the largest convention facilities on the West Coast, while the Reno Events Center provides additional downtown exhibit space and serves as a venue for concerts by today's top performers.
